

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. The Ontario Snowboard Development Team consists of those athletes formally named by Ontario Snowboard (OS) and who are then eligible to receive support directly from OS, if funding becomes available.
- 2. Eligible athletes named as members of Ontario Snowboard Development team will be considered based on the following ages as outlined in section 14
 - Slopestyle/Halfpipe: aged 10-12 years old as of December 31st, 2022, born in the years 2010, 2011 & 2012
 - Alpine/Snowboardcross: aged 13-15 years old as of December 31st, 2022, born in the years 2007, 2008 & 2009
 - Para-Snowboard: case by case basis
- 3. This *"The Ontario Snowboard Development Team Selection Protocol"* sets out the process of:
 - a. Identifying those athletes who are eligible for selection to the 2022-2023 Ontario Snowboard Development Team in all the snowboard disciplines; Alpine, Halfpipe, Slopestyle & Big Air, Snowboardcross and Para-Snowboard; and
 - b. Determining which athletes shall be offered positions on the 2022-2023
 Alpine, Halfpipe, Slopestyle & Big Air, Snowboardcross and Para-Snowboard Ontario Snowboard Development Team.
- 4. This Ontario Snowboard Development Team Selection Protocol and other Ontario Snowboard Selection Protocols are published on the Ontario Snowboard web site (<u>www.ontariosnowboard.ca</u>).
- 5. Athletes eligible for selection to the Ontario Snowboard Development Team are identified, ranked and offered Ontario Snowboard Development Team positions according to OS's formal 'Selection Process' detailed in this document.

TERMS:

- 6. The following abbreviated terms are used in the Selection Protocol:
 - FIS Federation Internationale de Ski
 - OS Ontario Snowboard
 - CS Canada Snowboard
 - CRL Canadian Ranking List



- HPP High Performance Program
- CSCP Canadian Snowboard Coaching Program
- LTAD Long Term Athlete Development
- PGS Parallel Giant Slalom
- PSL Parallel Slalom
- SBX Snowboardcross
- SS Slopestyle
- BA Big Air
- HP Halfpipe

GENERAL CONSIDERATION:

- 7. The Selection Committee will be comprised of the HPP Manager, and the High-Performance Committee.
- 8. The Selection Committee will meet on or before September 20th, 2022 to identify and recommend athletes for selection to the Ontario Snowboard Development Team for the 2022-2023 season.
- 9. Ontario Snowboard will notify recommended athletes and post selections no later than September 30th, 2022.
- 10. The Selection Committee's recommendations shall be made based on the athletes' performance during the 2021-2022 season.
- 11. All Ontario Snowboard Development Team athletes' selections are for a oneyear period, ending on May 31st, 2023.

The maximum number of available positions in the Ontario Snowboard Development Team shall be identified at the outset of the selection process. **Note:** Due to constraints, Ontario Snowboard may **not** be able to support the athletes financially.

12. Athlete's ranking based on the selection process will ordinarily determine the order of selection (for available Ontario Snowboard Development Team positions). However, the Ontario Snowboard HPP Manager has the right to recommend athletes for selection in an order other than that indicated by the



rankings. The grounds for any such recommendations must be set out in detail and must be in accordance with the Exceptional Considerations set out below.

IDENTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY:

- 13. To be eligible for selection to the Ontario Snowboard Development Team, an athlete must:
 - a. Be in good standing with Ontario Snowboard
 - b. Have had Ontario as their province of origin/place of residence for the prior 12 months.
 - c. Be a member of an active club/program with OS or CS, working with a CSCP licensed coach whose training/certification fulfills the needs of the LTAD stage 4-5 athletes
 - d. Have held an OS membership for the 2021-2022 season
 - e. Have participated in a minimum number of events as detailed below based on discipline;
 - Alpine minimum of two (2) Ontario Snowboard Points Series events in PGS or PSL and the Ontario Provincial Championships in the program year just-concluded.
 - Freestyle minimum of two (2) CRL events with a value of 5 or higher and the Ontario Provincial Championships in the program year just-concluded.
 - Snowboardcross minimum of two (2) Ontario Snowboard Points Series events
 - Para-Snowboard minimum of two (2) Ontario Provincial Points Series events

14. Age:

- Slopestyle/Halfpipe: aged 10-12 years old as of December 31st, 2022, born in the years 2010, 2011 & 2012
- Alpine/Snowboardcross: aged 13-15 years old as of December 31st, 2022, born in the years 2007, 2008 & 2009
- Para-Snowboard: case by case basis
- 15. An athlete who does not meet the eligibility criteria set out above may be considered for the selection if she or he meets the conditions of the Exceptional Circumstances provisions set out below.

TEAM STRUCTURE:



- 16. Ontario Snowboard will name athletes in the Olympic disciplines (Alpine, Freestyle and Snowboardcross)) and one (1) Para-snowboard discipline (Snowboardcross). Genders will be weighted by participation with a minimum of one (1) athlete per discipline per gender (where applicable).
- 17. A maximum of 30 athletes will be named to the Ontario Snowboard Development Teams, with a maximum of 3 athletes named to the Ontario Snowboard Development Team per discipline per gender.

ATHLETE SELECTION CRITERIA:

- 18. Alpine/Snowboardcross
 - a. Priority 1
 - Any Ontario athlete who is named the 2022 Canadian U15 National Champion or 2022 Ontario Snowboard U15 Provincial Champion will automatically be named to the development team.
 - b. Priority 2
 - Any Ontario athlete who is named the 2022 Canadian U13 National Champion or 2022 Ontario Snowboard U13 Provincial Champion will automatically be named to the development team.
 - c. Priority 3
 - 1. Riders will be ranked, within their category and by gender, by first determining their Ontario rank using the Ontario Provincial Overall Series Rank. Each athlete's rank will then be divided by the number of participants x 100 to determine their percentage of rank.
 - d. Priority 4
 - 1. If team positions remain, riders new to competitive snowboarding can be considered based on Coach recommendation
- 19. Slopestyle & Big Air/Halfpipe
 - a. Priority 1
 - 1. Any Ontario athlete who is named the Canadian National or Ontario Snowboard Provincial Champion will automatically be named to the Provincial Team.



- b. Priority 2
 - The most current Canadian Ranking List for the respective disciplines as of June 1st, 2022 will be used to determine the ranking order.
- c. Priority 3
 - 1. If team positions remain, riders new to competitive snowboarding can be considered based on Coach recommendation
- 20. Para-Snowboard
 - a. Any Ontario athlete named 2022 Para-Snowboard National or Provincial Champion will be named to the team.
 - b. Para-Snowboard athletes will have needed to participate in a minimum of 2 provincial events to be considered.

EXCEPTIONAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- 21. An athlete may be considered for the Development Team if she or he resides outside of the province of Ontario as they attend school, but Ontario remains their primary place of residence. In such circumstances the athlete shall remain eligible for selection.
- 22. An athlete may be considered for the Development Team if she or he resides outside of the province of Ontario to receive the required level of training not available in Ontario and is out of the province temporarily during the year. (i.e. Due to lack of facilities, coaching, and/or competitions).
- 23. It may occur that an athlete may, by reason of a health-related curtailment of activities or extraordinary circumstance, be unable to participate in the Ontario Provincial Championships. In such circumstances the athlete shall remain eligible for selection.
- 24. It may occur that an athlete may, by reason of a health-related curtailment of activities or extraordinary circumstance, be unable to participate in the Ontario Provincial Championships. In such circumstances the athlete shall remain eligible for selection.



25. Para-Snowboard athletes may be waived the requirement of a club membership for the 2021-22 season due to the nature of developing Para-Snowboard programs in the province.

ATHLETIC OBLIGATION:

- 26. As part of the Ontario Snowboard Ontario Snowboard Development Team athletes will be required to meet the following expectation and obligation.
 - a. Participate in a minimum of two (2) fitness testing sessions scheduled (if testing is possible) for the athlete's pre and post season. If the athlete is unable to attend the fitness testing session, they will be required to submit testing results within two (2) weeks of the scheduled session.
 - b. Participate in any auxiliary training organized and scheduled by OS for athletes.
 - c. Participate in the minimum number of events required to be eligible for selection to the team for the discipline they represent.
 - d. Always act and participate in a respectful and sportsman like manner while representing OS.
 - e. Adhere to the OS Athlete Code of Conduct
 - f. Always wear supplied OS clothing for award ceremonies, podium appearances, and other team appearances as directed by OS.

APPEALS:

27. Appeals to Ontario Snowboard's Provincial Team Selections may be made by any member of Ontario Snowboard who is materially affected by the selection, and who is a member in good standing. Appeals must be made under OS's Appeals Policy which can be found on Ontario Snowboard's website www.ontariosnowboard.ca. A non-refundable appeal fee of \$50 shall apply.
